Fund Year 8: 1st January to 31st December 2023



Greencoat UK Wind Ltd, owner the Stroupster Wind Farm, makes an annual donation to benefit the groups and organisations in the Dunnet & Canisbay Community Council area. The Fund is held and administered by Foundation Scotland who receive and process applications. Decisions on awards are made by the Stroupster Community Fund Panel. The Panel is made up of nine local people, four are nominated by the Community Council and five are self-nominated and potentially elected from the wider community.

including 33 awards to community groups totalling £304,764




.. and 13 awards towards driving lessons totalling £6,500...

Awards to community groups in 2023



During Year 8, the Panel made 33 awards totalling £304,764. 13 of these (£154,618) were to groups or projects based within the Dunnet & Canisbay area and the other 20 (£150,146) were to groups or projects based elsewhere in Caithness.

Education and Training Bursaries in 2023

An educational grant can cover a number of costs linked to study. First time applicants can apply for up to £1,500, a second time applicant can apply for up to £1,000 and going forward a person will be able to apply for up to £750 for future courses.

The purpose of this fund is to improve local people's opportunities for employment. You don't have to be unemployed to apply. The process is quick with awards made usually within six weeks of receiving the application.

During 2023, 32 people received an educational grant. These were:



13 young people aged 17 or 18 towards the cost of driving lessons and the driving tests.



10 young people aged under 25 who wanted to go away to college or university. These are the courses they selected:

Fund Impact

The Fund received its first donation from Greencoat UK Wind in 2016. Annual payments are £5,000 per MW of installed capacity at the wind farm and are index linked. Payments will be made over the 25 years the windfarm is likely to be operational. The 2023 annual donation, received in January 2023 was £206,972. The 2024 annual donation was received a little early, in December 2023, was £217,114.51.
