Record breaking year for Lairg Wind Farm Community Fund

Year 11, 1 January 2021 to 31 December 2021



About the Fund

- During 2021, 12 awards were made totalling over £32,000.
- The Fund has made 98 awards since it began, allocating around £176,500.
- During 2021 the fund received £28,380.00 from Lairg Windfarm Ltd – operator of the three-turbine wind farm at Cnoc Na Inghinnin.
- Vital support was provided to local organisations to adapt to Covid 19 restrictions and continue delivering for the community.
- The Fund supports charitable activities which benefit people living within the Lairg Community Council area.

Year 11 Awards

- 1) Light Up Lairg £1,500 Towards ongoing costs of erecting and maintaining Lairg Christmas lights.
- 2) Lairg Crofters Show £3,186.88 To purchase equipment to support the show including new tables, sheep hurdles and cattle pens.
- 3) Lairg and District Community Initiatives £2,586 To replace signs at Church Hill Woods with aluminium and polycarbonate signs to benefit local people and visitors.
- 4) Lairg Gala Week £2,000 To fund the groups lockup rental costs and insurance for the remaining months of 2021.
- 5) Lairg and District Community Initiatives £4,897 To contribute to office rental, bookkeeping costs, and accountancy fees April 2021 to March 2022.
- 6) Lairg Community Association Children's party £1,500 Towards the annual Lairg Christmas party for the children of Lairg between 0 and 12.
- 7) Lairg In Bloom £1,500 To fund floral displays in the village during the summer months.
- 8) **Lochview Rural Training £5,000** To fund two sessional part time staff to run rural youth crofting programmes through the summer and to purchase educational resources.
- East Sutherland Citizens Advice Bureau £4,517 To extend the 'Rural Recovery' project by one extra day per week to include the Lairg Community Council area.
- 10) Lairg Gala Week £1,700 To fund the 2021 pre-Christmas community activities including a Nursery trip, Panto trip and over 60s party.
- 11) Lairg Crofters Show £2,800 To cover the cost of storage containers for a crofters show.
- 12) Lairg Gala Week £1,700 fund purchase of silent disco equipment and laptop.
