Greencoat Stroupster Wind Farm Community Benefit Fund



Greencoat UK Wind Ltd, owner the Stroupster Wind Farm, makes an annual donation to benefit the groups and organisations in the Dunnet & Canisbay Community Council area. The Fund is held and administered by Foundation Scotland who receive and process applications. Decisions on awards are made by the Stroupster Community Fund Panel. The Panel is made up of nine local people, four are nominated by the Community Council and five are self-nominated and elected from the wider community.

History of Awards

The **Stroupster Wind Farm Community Benefit Fund** launched in 2016 and has made **111 awards** to community groups.

This report is for Year 6 of the Fund. This year, **13 awards** were made to community groups.

The **Dunnet & Canisbay Education and Training Fund** launched in 2019 and has awarded grants to **39 individuals**.

This year, **17 individuals** were awarded an Education & Training grant.

The Fund supports projects outwith the Dunnet & Canisbay area and, so far, 22% of the spend has been to projects outwith the Fund area.

Year 6 Community Fund Awards

During Year 6, the Panel considered 15 grant applications and made 14 awards totalling £117,758:

- 1) Caithness Voluntary Group £1,500 To offer free transport to people over 70 and disabled people who have not got their own means of transport to enable uptake of the covid-19 vaccine.
- 2) **Brough Bay Association £4112** To create a heritage exhibit including a display boat, information panel, seating and wildflowers.
- Caithness Astronomy Group £5542 To buy a robotic telescope to enable observations online.
- 4) **Scottish Ornithologists Club £43,647** To improve access for all-ability visitors and to increase safe breeding areas for terns at St. John's Pool Bird Reserve, Dunnet, so as to enhance biodiversity and understanding and appreciation of it amongst residents and visitors alike.
- 5) Wick Academy Youth Football Club £1,900 To purchase football training equipment and clothing for 20 young people and coaches.
- 6) **Caithness Voluntary Group £6,908** To fund a Development Officer who will support development trusts in Caithness with project development.
- 7) John O'Groats Development Trust £8,000 To design and develop a Mobile App for John O'Groats which can be used by visitors and residents, providing information about walks and trails, historical and natural sites of interest, folklore, services and businesses.

- 8) **Venture North Cooperative Limited £1,983** To purchase mobile kitchen equipment and storage to enable Venture North to enhance the 'Taste North' annual food festival to showcase Caithness and Sutherland.
- 9) Brough Bay Association £30,793 To undertake significant improvements to the slipway and to create a new car park, turning area and steps to the beach, safeguarding the harbour area so that people can continue to use it for work and recreation for many years.
- 10) Thurso Pipe Band £1,200 To contribute towards the Band's core costs including insurance and rent as group recovers from covid lockdown to safeguard the Band's future.
- 11) **John O'Groats Mill Trust £8,500** To create the John O'Groats Mill Trail: an accessible coastal path joining the centre of John O'Groats to the cultural centre of John O'Groats Mill.
- 12) **Castletown Youth Club £3,219** To contribute towards the Club's core costs to help the Club recover from covid lockdown to safeguard the Club's future.
- 13) **Keiss School Parent Council £450** Towards the 2021 Primary 7 personal development course in Fairburn Activity Centre to ease the transition to High School for rural children.

Year 6 Education & Training Fund Awards

The Education & Training Fund offers bursaries to people living in the Dunnet & Canisbay area to access training and education opportunities that better equip them with the range of skills required to enter into or retain employment. First time applicants can apply for up to £1,500, a second time applicant can apply for up to £1,000 and going forward a person will be able to apply for up to £300 for future courses. Multi-year courses such as HND's or Degrees are also eligible and will be subject to the same caps.

17 individuals were awarded an educational grant this year helping to cover the costs of further education and training including course fees, accommodation, subsistence, equipment and tools. The awards made in 2021, which total £30,405, were:

- **1.** £1,500 towards Level 4 Diploma Financial Planning through the Chartered Institute of Engineering
- **2.** £1,500 to undertake cat 1 Driving Rigid Training and Test in Orkney
- **3.** £605 to fund trailer test driving lessons and test
- 4. £1,500 to take the Category C Rigid Driving Test
- **5.** £1,500 to fund the CPC and HGV Class 1 training and test fees
- **6.** £1,500 to fund course fees and travel to undertake the Start Up Brewing short course
- **7.** £3,100 towards BEng Electrical and Electronic Engineering

- 8. £1,500 towards Masters Mechanical Engineering
- **9.** £1,600 over three years BSc Game Development
- 10. £1,000 for Hairdressing Level 3
- 11. £300 towards HND Engineering Systems
- **12.** £3,100 towards BSc Immunology
- **13.** £2,800 towards MA (Hons) English and Film Studies
- 14. £2,500 towards Master of Occupational Therapy
- 15. £2,500 towards MEng Robotics
- 16. £1,500 towards Sport and Fitness BSc
- **17.** £1,500 towards SVQ 3 Vehicle Diagnostics Technician

Financial Overview

The Fund received its first donation from Greencoat UK Wind in 2016. Annual payments are £5,000 per MW of installed capacity at the wind farm and are index linked. Payments will be made over the 25 years the windfarm is likely to be operational. A summary of Greencoat Stroupster Community Fund finances for Year 6 is provided below.
